


United nations high commissioner

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The United Nations (UN) was created at a time when the nations of the world aspired to work together to bring peace. The world headquarters of the United Nations is in, but not of, New York City: It is an 18-acre international area belonging to its nations. Visitors can start during a tour of the United Nations when they realize they are in what amounts to a separate nation-state with its own fire department and post office. The United Nations Headquarters is often regarded as the imposing glass building on the East River -- the high-rise visible in movies and news. The complex actually combines four main buildings. Three were completed in 1952: the 39-storey Secretariat Building, the General Assembly Building and the Conference Building. In 1961 the Dag Hammarskjold Library was added. The General Assembly Hall, where representatives of the 191 UN nations meet, is the largest hall in the headquarters, with more than 1800 seats. A submissive space, features the UN emblem (a surprising rarity within the complex) and abstract murals designed by French artist Fernand Leger. On the eve of the 60th anniversary of the United Nations, the organization’s administrators began planning for a long-term renovation of its three main buildings. The 18-acre campus on Manhattan’s East Side has been hit by asbestos, outdated HVAC systems, deteriorating glass facades, and decades of cigarette smoke lining the walls. There was talk of tearing down and starting over, but in the end, the iconic buildings of International Style were considered worthy of preservation. The massive undertaking took 6 years, a process documented in the United Nations at 70: Restoration and Renewal (Rizzoli, \$55), a celebratory monograph released earlier this month featuring an architectural history written by Carter Wiseman. In 1946, the Rockefeller family donated land to the United Nations site, allowing New York to win against other contenders, including San Francisco, Boston and Philadelphia. The Secretariat building, a thin 39-storey tower, was the first in the city to use curtain glass walls, and in the renovation, all 5,040 squares were replaced to remedy creeping leaks. But there is a turning point: not only do they work together to demand frequent waste collection or decent street lighting, as always retailers, they also combine to organize promotional galas, to conduct consumer surveys, and to buy large-scale advertising. Especially because © shopkeepers are usually too busy running their shops to take time for meetings or to negotiate with city policy. Even when they take their time, their often exuberant individualism sometimes prevents them from reaching a consensus. However, in several cities, retailers have developed ingenious ways to bridge the gap between their need to get together and their reluctance to spend time or money to do so. The small shops of the center have formed a private company dedicated exclusively to the concerns of shop owners in what the Philadelphians call Center City. A composite and non-profit organization, The Center City Proprietors (CAP) spends taxes every year from close to 400 members for a variety of services. These include reduced group health plans, accessible advertising packages, annual business seminars, promotional events, discounted credit card rates, social gatherings and more. Only this year, the PAC added 120 new members. In St. Paul, Minn, the twenty-two-year-old Grand Avenue Business Association (GABA), once a harmless street organization formed by few serious retailers, has grown increasingly aggressive over the years. With the opening of shops along the street, and with the flourishing activity in the area, the promotional events of GABA, such as the Grand Meander and the Grand Old Day, have become huge organizational enterprises, while non-members receive as many benefits as members. Non-members also benefit from GABA’s lobbying efforts, from investigations to detail and from the overall improvement of the neighbourhood. Recently, in an attempt to involve all Grand Avenue retailers in its activities, GABA and a local bank have worked with the city to enact legislation that would transform Grand Avenue into a special rating neighborhood. Under the agreement, traders would automatically pay taxes based on the size of the warehouse to a central management, which would direct the retail business along Grand Avenue. In recent years, California, North Carolina, New York, Washington, Maryland and Pennsylvania have all enacted legislation for such special districts. Along North Shattuck Avenue in Berkeley, Calif, the negotiators have solved the problems of meetings and taxes completely the organization --relying, in a true sixty style, on the correct way of thinking in order to enforce the Community standards. When a mortuary was razed and a miniature erected in its place, local shopkeepers nicknamed the project The Dead Center and ignored it. Of course, the shops within the mall were subject to constant turnover. Shopping malls are bad.
