The first single album, "Save Me", was launched July 15, 2008. It is currently available for digital sale in all major online retailers (iTunes, Amazon, Rhapsody, etc.). The Álbum was promoted by 97.5 to Blaze, a radio station in Salt Lake City under KZZQ call sign (formerly KHTB). In addition, the songs "Devils & Angels" and "here they are originally launched at the band's former radbum, after chaos II. You know, they love a guitar crevice that they can play, and the drummer loves this beat or filling that he can play down and ... then yes, this writing process is incredible. The studio can be stressful because you are at the moment, but you also have 1,000 people shouting the music in you or giving you the vibe and is much easier to get to the moment, feel the Música, when you have a lot of people, feel the energy of the crowd. The stove is not my favorite thing. Being in the recording of the studio is much rush and expect things. So it's your time and you have to fit to try to get the best performance and not always is easy. That's why I think often people are, man, you sound better live, then you do in the registry. This is because of energy, you know, you have the fans. We feed the fans and this energy in the room and you can really get your emotion. It's like, in these songs, the public is my therapist, I'm spitting these lyrics about my life and telling a story, and it's hard to tell a story for a microphone with headphones. Every time I make a video clip where I'm singing, I try to sing as strong as you can, then it looks real, and it's real, to a point. But this was the cool thing about it, because it really captured many of the moments of me really crawling the music. Everyone usually tracing the music. So, it was what was cool. It's as if I almost want free time and record a music, and it's cool. Music Madness: How would you describe your sound for people who are not familiar with your music? We will find songs that you can not relate to really, but I assure you all of you all records that there will be at least some music that you relate. And all the album we do, we write 50 damn music, and make sure the best 10 or 11 or 12 make the ilbum, and we put the maximum of time in all the tracks like You can not be a single radio or can be a popular music. We make sure all the music are impressive. I mean, we still strive to write a road trip CD. It is difficult to find more than every music says a story and people can relate to it. You get to the next track, and there's something you love in this track that was different from the lane before, and they do not sound all the same, but you can say that is the same band. I think we really are diverse in our sound, and having the two different guitarists, Sean, who used to be in Candlebox and Taylor. They have completely different flavors and the music that we wrote are ours. We wrote everything, so I think you can say much of what we do, and you get this vibration of authenticity in our music that you do not enter into many other bands. Madness: Absolutely, I can see it.
