## Document photo iphone

Once you open the app, create a new note, tap on the camera icon, and select "Scan Documents." Hold your phone above the document and it will automatically capture the page. In Manual mode it's up to you to press the white camera button when you are happy with the position of the yellow box.Manual is the best option if the page you are scanning has boxes, as Notes will tend to focus on the box rather than the whole page (if this happens you can still rescue your scan afterwards, as the camera will capture the whole page anyway, we'll explain how to do this below).After the scan is taken you have the option to 'Drag near corners to adjust' which essentially means you can drag the corners to adjust the edges of the scan. A blurry scan is no good to anybody. You can adjust the corners if necessary, and then save it as a PDF or image file. Yes, you can scan multiple pages into one document by continuing to position and scan each page before saving. Remember, you can also sign or mark up your scanned documents right in the Notes app before sharing them. Create a new note. So be sure you want to delete!How to name your ScansiOS calls them Scanned Documents by default, but luckily you can make it easier to locate your scans by renaming them. Scan Your Document: Just like in the Notes app, the camera will open, and your iPhone will automatically detect the document. Tap on the camera icon within your new note.Now, you'll see a camera icon on the bottom of the screen. You've got everything you need right in your pocket. No, you can scan as many pages as you need. Apple Apples has a feature called Continuity that runs across its devices, from iPhone and iPad to Mac, allowing your devices to work better together. You can choose from Colour (best for magazines), Greyscale (to turn photos into shades of grey), Black & White (possibly the best option for a black and white print out - although greyscale can look better), and Photo (if you are scanning a photo). Flat Surface: Place the document on a flat surface for better alignment. In an open note, you can also tap the More button, then tap Scan to scan a document. You will see the number of scans you have taken in brackets.If you later decide to remove one of the scans, tap on it and delete by tapping on the bin icon.In your Note you will see the first page you have scanned, along with part of the second page. To do so, open the Scan and tap on the Filters icon again.For example, to make the scanned photo look like a line drawing try the Black & White optionOnce you are happy with your scan, open it, press and hold until you see Copy Delete Share and choose Share.Select Save Image from the options and this will add it to your Photos app.We think that the quality of the image might be better if you photograph using the Camera app, but the Scanning function does a very good job of countering skew if you are scanning an image that isn't very well lined up.How to use the iPhone scanner to photograph a computer or TV screenSometimes you can't take a screenshot in the normal way, in which case the scanning function on the iPhone can come in very handy.For example, if you are trying to get a shot of the Disk Utilities screen on a Mac running recovery mode, or if you want to capture something on the Apple TV interface.To scan a screen just follow the steps above but hold your iPhone up to the screen when you are scanning. When this is selected, the camera will automatically frame and scan your photo or document.If you are in manual mode, line the document up (a yellow box appears around it) and press the shutter button. Whether you're scanning receipts, contracts, or handwritten notes, your iPhone can handle it all. Here's how: Open a supported application on your Mac (such as Mail, Messages, Notes) Control-click in the document window where you want to scanned document to appear, or choose File > Insert You'll then need to select 'Import or Insert from iPhone or iPad' Then choose 'Scan Document' This will open the camera app on your iPhone or iPad Place the document in the view of your iPhone/iPad's camera Save the scan The scanned document will automatically appear on your Mac in the application you opened at the start One of the best new features that arrived in iOS 11 (reviewed here) was the ability to scan a document using your iPhone.Prior to the launch of iOS 11 you might have used your iPhone camera to photograph important documents that you wanted to keep a copy of. Just choose the location and tap on Add.Another option is to create a PDF, which you can share - although the document you send or save to Files will always be a PDF.You could also choose to Copy to eBooks for reading as a PDF later.Of course, you can also open Notes on your Mac or iPad and view the scans there too.How to add a scanned image to PhotosIf you want to save the image to your Photo library you need to press hard on the image until you see Copy Delete Share options.Then tap on Share and you will see Save Image option (you won't see this option if you click on Share in the top right of the Notes app.How to find your scans in NotesIf you want to view all the scans you have made in Notes or share it, so that you are in the library view, then tap on the icon in the bottom left (four small boxes)Scroll down to Scans and swipe through to see everything you have scanned.Or Tap on Show All to see all your scans in a Photos library-like view.Alternatively, you can see all Scans grouped according to the set of scans you made if you scroll down to Documents and tap on See All. If you want to scan a document to add to the document you are editing on your Mac, just right-click (or control-click) where you want to add the image and choose Insert from your iPhone or iPad > Scan Documents. Choose "Scan Documents" A menu will pop up with several options—select Scan Documents. If it doesn't automatically capture the scan, you can press the shutter button manually. Using Third-Party Apps for Advanced Scanning While the native iPhone apps do a great job of scanning, there are also several third-party scanner apps for iPhone that offer additional features, such as multi-page scanning, OCR (Optical Character Recognition), and better image quality. The photo version will still be a PDF if you choose to share it via the Notes app thoughRotate allows you to rotate by 90-degree increments.Delete will delete one page of the scan at a time. Tap on the scan in the bottom left corner and tap on the crop tool You can then drag the corners to adjust your scan Tap 'Done' Then tap 'Save' You can also scan a photo or document using the Mail app. If the document is multiple pages, you can scan them all in one go. There are of course a number of third party apps for scanning, some of which offer some useful features, but if you just want to scan and send a document or photo, or sign a document using just your iPhone or iPad, here's how to do it. There you have it! Scanning a document with your iPhone is a straightforward process that can be done anywhere, anytime. You can then swipe across to see any other scans you have made in that seriesTo see a bigger version of each scan just tap on the scan.How to edit a scan taken on the iPhoneTo make edits to the scan select the scan, then select one of the options that appear along the bottom of the scan, including Crop, Filters, Rotate and Delete.Crop allows you to change the corners of the image so that you can line it up better or counter any skewing.The Filters icon is the one in the centre that shows three circles. You may also have also used your iPhone to photograph old photos.Of course, these photographed 'scans' wouldn't be great quality. When you attempted to crop them you'd often find that you had a trapezoid shape, and you'd run the risk of losing some of the edge as you attempted to make it look more professional.And if you were 'scanning' important documents in order to keep them filed on your phone you'd need to remember to file them in an album in your Photos app. Repeat the process until you've scanned all pages. The Notes app will combine them into a single document. Hold your iPhone above it, and watch as it magically recognizes the document and captures the page. It comes with built-in OCR to recognize text and allows for PDF creation. Now you can save it straight to your notes or share it via email or messages by tapping the share icon. The app will automatically detect the edges of the document and take a photo. You can then share the scanned document via email, messaging apps, or save it to cloud storage services like iCloud or Google Drive. 3. Note that if you delete it doesn't look like the delete scan gets saved anywhere so there is no fail-safe like there is in Photos when a deleted photo isn't actually deleted for 30 days. Give it a tap and a few options will pop up. Adjust the Scan: After the document is captured, you can adjust the corners, crop, or rotate the image to ensure it's perfectly aligned. Navigate to a Folder: Choose the folder where you want to save the scanned document. You can change these setting later if required.Hold the iPhone over the document you wish to scan until you see a yellow box form over the top of the text. Keep your hands steady. They are saved in the Notes app, but you can also save them to the Files app or share them through email or messages. If it doesn't automatically scan, you can press the shutter button. You may not know it, but your iPhone, iPad and iPod touch all have a hidden scanner embedded in their software, allowing you to scan photos and scan and send documents without you needing a third party app. Even if the page isn't straight Notes will apply perspective correction and do a pretty good job of un-skewing your scan, but you can help it by editing the box so it follows the lines of the text.Tap Keep Scan once you are happy you have neatly cropped the image.If you don't see the option to drag corners after taking the scan, you can still crop it. You can also manually adjust the scan area. Save or Share the Scan: Once you're satisfied with the scan, tap Save. Tap Save to store the scan in the Files app. So, next time you need to scan something, remember your iPhone is already equipped with everything you need to make it happen. 5. Scanning with the Files App If you prefer organizing your scans directly within the Files app, you can also scan documents there. If you try and view a scan on an older iPhone you will see a message saying that you need to update to iOS 11 to view the attachment.How to scan using the iPhoneOpen the Notes app.Create a new Note by tapping the square with a pen icon.Or, if you are wanting to add a scanned document to an existing Note, open that.At the bottom of the Note you will see a + icon. Use the Auto-Scan Feature: Take advantage of your iPhone's automatic edge detection to speed up the process and reduce the need for manual adjustments.
