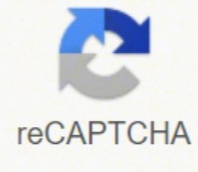

YES! It was so exciting for me, but also for her! One of the simplest explanations for the purpose of syllables is to help kids break down words into 'chunks.' This can help children sound out words and read faster, as well as more accurately. (These reduced effort hole punches are great for younger kids, as others can be a bit tricky to squeeze.) I created the printables in black and white to save some colored ink. What's Included? When I am creating activities for my daughter, I am always thinking ahead for new ways that the activity can be used. To learn and to read is to light a fire; every syllable that is spelled out is a spark that glows the eagerness to learn and understand the English language better. *For even more low-prep activities for the whole year, be sure to grab our Kindergarten Math and Literacy Printables BUNDLE! When my daughter came home from school talking about syllables I was so excited! Turn them into a writing activity: A writing utensil can be used to circle or color the number that corresponds with the number of syllables. If they cannot, take the time to teach them and give them common words with open syllables. Then, help the writer in the picture finish her book. Before beginning this worksheet, you must first make sure that your child knows what open syllables are. This free printable packet includes four different pages for counting syllables. It improves their spelling, writing, and reading skills. The pages can be laminated to extend the life of the activity. Make clip cards; Cut each block out. That is why I included a picture as well as the written word. Many kids can identify syllables before they can read the larger words.
